



# Benicia Refinery CAP

## 2019 Annual Report

The Benicia Refinery Community Advisory Panel (CAP) met four times in 2019 and received updates and presentations from refinery management, the city's fire department, the Benicia Historical Museum and the Bay Area Air Quality Management District about different aspects related to the refinery. Minutes and presentation material of each meeting are provided within this packet. A brief description about each meeting is listed below.

### Meeting Recap

#### March 12, 2019

The CAP received a quarterly update about refinery operations, safety, environmental, regulatory, community and government affairs from refinery personnel. A power point presentation was presented about the Valero Benicia Asphalt Plant. Direction was given to review the CAP and Fence Line websites at the June CAP meeting.

#### June 11, 2019

The CAP received a quarterly update about refinery operations, a presentation about community ambient air monitoring along and an overview of the CAP & Fence Line websites. City representatives gave an update about their emergency response plans and alert systems. The next meeting will highlight the refinery's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

#### September 10, 2019

The CAP received a quarterly update about refinery operations, safety, environmental, regulatory, community and government affairs from refinery personnel. A power point presentation was presented by the Benicia Historical Museum detailing the history of the arsenal, industrial park and refinery. The December CAP meeting will be open to the public and a presentation from the Air District about on monitoring at refineries in communities will occur.

#### December 10, 2019

The CAP received a quarterly about refinery operations and they highlighted charitable contributions that were recently distributed to local non-profit charities. A power point presentation was presented by the Air District giving the public audience an overview about air monitoring programs at refineries and in nearby communities.
